The annual Study in France Fair, co-organized by the French Institute of Greece and the French Institute of Thessaloniki with the participation of many French Universities and Higher Education Institutions, was successfully held in 2025. In addition, they were informed about the latest trends in transnational education, while providing information on the University and research programs offered by the University of the Peloponnese, as well as on student life in the cities where the Institution is based.

from abroad, the retention and utilization of talents (brain gain), is now a priority of Greek Higher Education, which, following the strategy of the European Education Area, aims to strengthen the internationalization and outreach of Greek Higher Education Institutions as well as to strengthen the geopolitical position of the EU.
